

### TUESDAY JUNE 10TH IS NATIONAL FROSTED ANIMAL COOKIE DAY!



### SURVEY RESULTS


mery Area Community Center has been serving residents of Polk County and surrounding areas for 39 years. We are committed to adapting and evolving so we can continue to meet the needs of the community. Each year we check in with our members via our annual survey to better understand how we are doing, who we are serving, and how the community benefits. 2024 survey results show that 71% of survey respondents visit the center once a week or more.

We asked our members about the benefits they receive:

- Having Fun
- Learning new things
- Meeting new people
- Connecting with people I know
- Making new friends


70% of respondents said they receive all five benefits, and another 12% reported 4 of these benefits. In all, 92% of respondents reported three or more of these benefits. Address data shows that the vast majority of members live in Amery, or the immediate vicinity.

These benefits not only enrich the lives of individuals but benefit our entire community!




# SOCIAL ACTIVITIES CONTRIBUTE TO BETTER HEALTH!

As we age, many of us are alone more often than when we were younger, leaving us vulnerable to social isolation and loneliness—and related health problems such as cognitive decline, depression, and heart disease. Socializing is essential for older adults, as it promotes mental, emotional, and physical well-being while reducing the risk of loneliness and isolation—both of which are linked to serious health concerns such as depression, cognitive decline, and even cardiovascular disease.



Research indicates that maintaining strong social connections can help prevent conditions like dementia and high blood pressure by reducing stress and encouraging a more active lifestyle. This is especially crucial for older adults in rural settings, where geographic isolation, limited transportation, and fewer social opportunities can make loneliness a significant concern. In these areas, participation in community groups, virtual social platforms, and local senior programs can be vital in fostering connections and improving overall health. Engaging in regular social interactions like those provided at the Amery Center helps older adults stay mentally sharp, emotionally fulfilled, and physically healthier, ultimately enhancing their quality of life!


